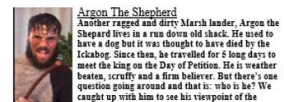
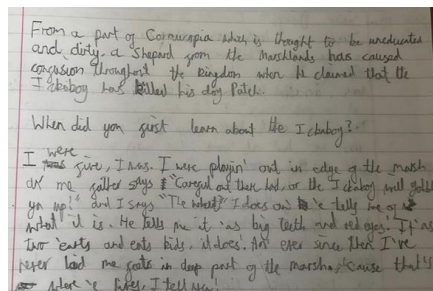
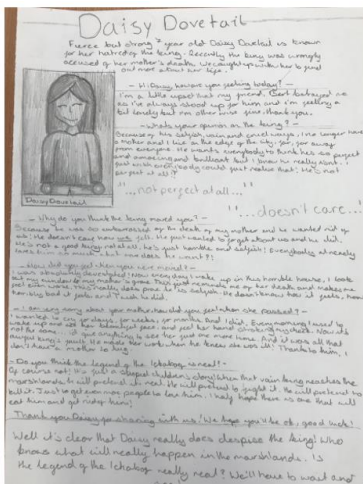
As lockdown guidelines continue to change, we will be constantly reviewing plans for next year and will keep you informed of any updates and changes.
