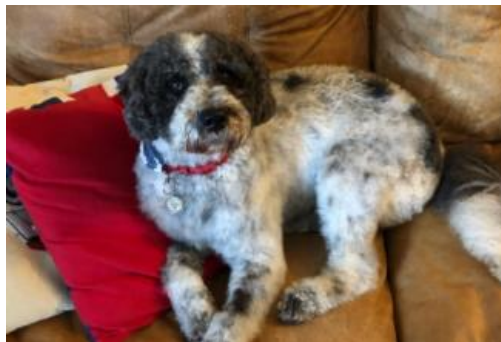


VE Day Celebrations

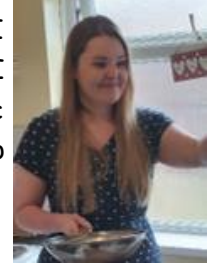
What have the teachers been up to?
