## Times of the Day

We are hoping that we will be able to return to all year groups starting and ending the day at the same time however, this will depend on government restrictions.



8:45 - 9:00 gates open

3:20 home time

Parents will be able to come onto the playground to drop their child off. Children should go straight into school when they arrive on the playground. We ask that parents leave the playground swiftly.

## Weekly Home Learning

All pupils are expected to complete weekly home learning.

Home learning day is a **Friday**.

Home learning covers:



1. times tables
2. spelling lists
3. reading



Weekly spellings will be sent out via parent mail, along with a reminder for reading and times tables home learning.

Teachers will check whether children have done their home learning on a Friday and test them on the spellings that have been sent home.

Children who regularly complete home learning to a high standard will be rewarded. Teachers will phone home when they are concerned that home learning is frequently not being completed.

## Staying Healthy at School



Healthy school dinners are available every day and include meat/ veg/ jacket potato and baguette options. These cost £2.40 and can be paid for using Parent mail.

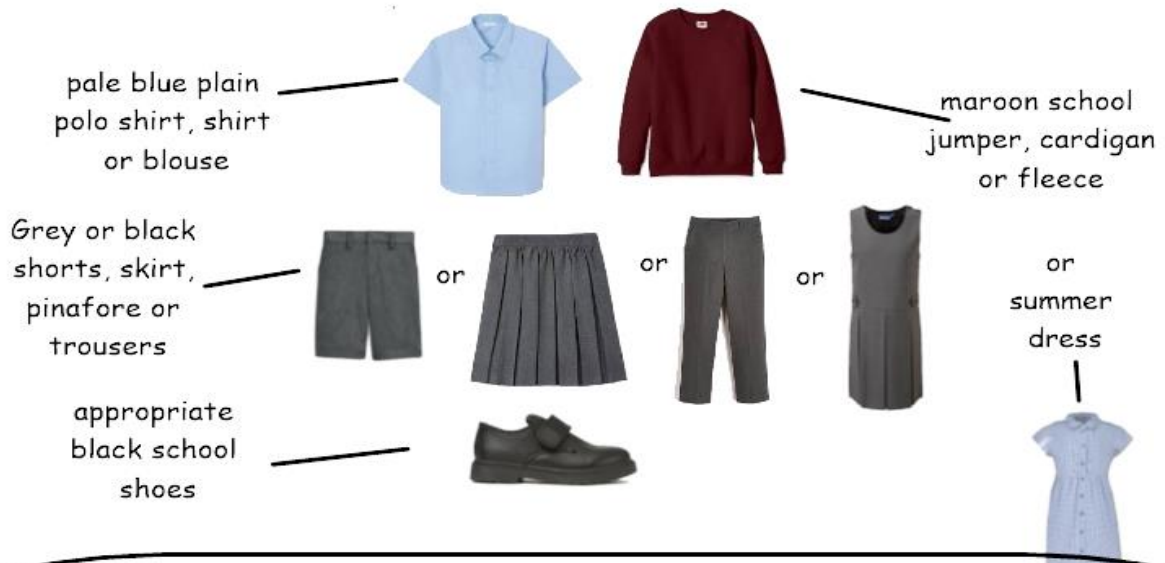
We ask that snacks that are brought into school for breaktime are healthy e.g. a piece of fruit.

## School Uniform



Children must attend school in their school uniform.

School uniform must consist of the above. Any child who is not in appropriate school uniform will not be allowed on the playground at break and lunchtime.

## P.E. Uniform



On P.E. days, Children must attend school in their P.E. uniform.

P.E. uniform must consist of the above. Any child who is not in appropriate P.E. uniform will not be allowed on the playground at break and lunchtime.

## Expectations of Behaviour

All classrooms have a behaviour chart and pupil's peg will be moved up and down the chart. Every lesson all pupils start on you're great!
